

Cookie Policy

Scave.World uses cookies on our website. When you visit our website, Scave.World may store certain information commonly known as a "cookie" on your computer. A cookie helps you and us get the best out of the website and helps Scave.World provide you with a customized service.

How does a cookie work?

When you visit a website, this website may send a small file containing letters and numbers to your computer. This file is then saved and used by your web browser. The information stored in this "cookie" may be retrieved when you revisit the same website to inform the website (and only that website) of your previous activity. A cookie cannot give us access to your computer or to information that goes beyond what you provide to us.

What information does a cookie contain?

A cookie contains the name of the server it came from, the lifetime of the cookie and a value, usually a randomly generated unique number.

Consent for cookies?

When you first visit the Scave.World website, you will be asked for permission to place cookies. You can hereby give permission for all cookies, by accepting the so-called "cookie bar" that appears at the first time. You can also choose whether or not to allow specific cookies by using the so-called "preference centre". You can also change or withdraw your preferences at any time through the preference centre.

Different types of cookies .

Below are some commonly used types of cookies, along with their purpose.

Cookie Purpose	Description
Essential cookies	A site may use a limited number of cookies that are essential for certain services that a user has requested or for security purposes. For example, a site may use a cookie for a shopping cart feature when a user makes a purchase. In particular if a user has registered on a site or is using a customer portal. A cookie is used to verify the device a user is using.
Performance cookies	Performance cookies are set to collect and report aggregated non-identifiable information, which can then be used to report on

	the website's performance and provide insight into how the site is currently being used and how it can be improved for your audience .
Functional cookies	Functional cookies support how a website functions. For example, by identifying a user's device on a unique but anonymous basis, a website can identify the user's language preferences.
Third party cookies	Third-party cookies are placed on a user's device. These are cookies from a domain other than the domain the user is visiting. Third-party cookies are often allowed by a web browser, but they can be blocked because they are widely used by advertisers to track browsing history.

Scave.World is committed to protecting the personal data you entrust to us. We employ robust, appropriate technologies and policies so that the information we hold about you is protected from unauthorized access and inappropriate use. For example, your online registration is encrypted and our own network is protected.

As part of the services we provide to you through the Scave.World website, the personal data you provide may be transferred to countries outside the European Economic Area (EEA). This can happen, for example, if the computer servers for hosting the website are located in a country outside the EEA. When Scave.World transfers your personal data to a country outside the EEA in this way, we take steps to ensure that your privacy rights remain protected as set out in this privacy statement.

The transfer of data to the US can be cited as an example of this. The data protection laws in the US are weaker than in the EEA and we will therefore ensure that any transmission of your data only takes place if security frameworks approved by the European Commission have been agreed with the other party. Examples of such frameworks are the Standard Contractual Clauses or the Binding Corporate Rules.

We do not store your data longer than reasonably necessary for the purpose stated in this privacy statement and for compliance with our legal obligations. We do not store more data than we need. The retention period depends on the purpose. For more information about the retention period of your data, please contact the Data Protection Officer. His / her contact details are stated in this statement.

When you request us to stop sending you direct marketing communications, we will retain minimal information (e.g. name, address or email address) to ensure that we honour such requests.

Your choices

We have tried to make it easy for you to access and modify the personal data we hold about you or to request that we stop contacting you. It is your data and we want to make sure you feel that you have control over it.

On our website you will find forms for exercising your rights as a data subject.
